Wine Rack Assembly Instructions

DIAGONAL CUBE DISPLAY



Congratulations! You have purchased the finest wine racking available anywhere. Properly assembled, your Vigilant wine racks will outlast even your finest wines. Please call toll free 888-812-4427 if you have any questions or problems.

Tools Required for Assembly

- Electric drill or cordless screw gun
- 9/64" drill bit
- Phillips Head Screwdriver
- #2 Square drive bit / #2 Phillips bit
- Hammer, preferably rubber or soft-faced

Tips for Building Your Wine Racks

If you are using a powered screw gun that has a clutch, make sure to set it at a low setting first until you find the right setting. If you have it set high it may over-tighten and then split the wood.

Pre-drill all screw holes with a 9/64" drill bit. This makes it less likely for your wood to split. (The easiest way to do this is to follow the pre-drilled holes provided on certain pieces as your guide.)


When attaching racks to adjacent racking we recommend using clamps to hold the adjacent racks together before securing with screws.

The best placement for your screws, to secure adjacent racks is behind the applied face frame. This keeps the screws hidden and keeps your rack secure and steady.


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2 - Side Panels (40" long)
1 - Top Panel (31<sup>1/32</sup>" long)
1 - Bottom Panel (31 <sup>1/32</sup>" long)
1 - Divider (37 <sup>1/32</sup>" long)
2 - Shelves (14 <sup>29/32</sup>" long)
4 - Diagonal Dividers (22 <sup>5/8</sup>" long)
2 - Nailers (32 <sup>1/4"</sup> long)
8 - #8 Square Head Screws (1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" long)
8 - Screw Head Caps
16 - Shelf Pins




STEPS FOR ASSEMBLY


1. Locate 1 side panel and the top panel. Standing both panels on edge, pre-drill the end of the top panel using the pre-drilled holes in the side panel as a reference. Apply a small bead of wood glue (not supplied) at this joint and screw the panels together.




2. Locate the divider and attach it to the top panel by pre-drilling into the end of the divider and fasten with screws.




3. Locate the other side panel and bottom panel and repeat steps 1 and 2.




4. Flip the carcass over so the edge banded side is on the work surface. Square up the carcass by taking diagonal measures until both measures are equal .




5. Using a pneumatic nailer apply the nailers to the back of the carcass making sure that the carcass remains squared up. If a pneumatic nailer is not available you can complete this step by pre-drilling through the nailers and fastening with screws (not supplied).



6. Stand the carcass up and insert the shelf pins in the predrilled holes. Insert the shelves making sure that the shelf pins are captured by the dado on the bottom of the shelves. This step can be completed once the unit is installed in the wine cellar to avoid potential damage.



7. Locate the diagonal dividers and insert them into the carcass. This step should be completed once the unit is installed in the wine cellar.



8. The assembly is complete!

How to Care for Your Stained & Lacquered Wine Racks

Your Vigilant wine racks are built using the highest quality wood and finish available. When properly cared for, your wine racks will last longer than your finest bottles of wine. Here are a few tips on maintaining the quality and consistency of your racking.

Remove Dust: Dust build up from small airborne particles may scratch the surface if not removed correctly. Simply wipe the surface with a cloth dampened with a non-wax cleaning polish or mild detergent.

Clean: Fingerprints, cooking fumes, smoking residue, etc., accumulate on any surface. None of these contaminants will harm our Satin lacquer finish, but they should be periodically removed to restore the finish to its original luster. Just wipe the surface with a cloth dampened with a non-wax containing polish or mild detergent solution. Avoid the use of ammonia based products or silicone oil, as they may cause damage if used over a long period of time.

Our satin lacquer finish is durable and resistant to most household spills. However, spills should be wiped up promptly to avoid potential problems.

Excessive prolonged exposure to direct sunlight, high temperatures and high humidity can cause damage to both the finish and the wood itself. These should be avoided.

Following these simple steps will keep your finished wine racks looking like new for many years.
